Samford University's McWhorter School of Pharmacy (MSOP) invites applications for a full-time, 12-month appointment in the Department of Pharmacy Practice at the rank of assistant, associate, or full professor. This faculty appointment is non-tenure track. This position will lead to the establishment and development of comprehensive pharmacy services in a new practice serving primarily an indigent population. The faculty member is expected to maintain a model practice of patient-centered care which will provide a rigorous base from which to teach didactic and experiential coursework and to develop a program of scholarship. Additional duties consistent with an MSOP faculty position are expected, including campus-based meeting attendance, maintenance of office hours and committee service.

Candidates should have a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an ACPE accredited college/school of pharmacy (or equivalent). A residency and/or fellowship training and a minimum of three (3) years of practice experience are required. Eligibility for Alabama state pharmacy licensure and eligibility to function as a supervising pharmacist under Alabama law are required. Previous experience in managing a community or ambulatory pharmacy practice is strongly desired. Candidates should exhibit effective verbal and written communication, well-developed interpersonal skills, dedication to student-centered education and a commitment to the university's Christian mission.
